FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR...

In politics, unity demands compromise. In the Church, it depends upon discernment; specifically, "keeping the main thing the main thing."

Paul, writing to the Romans, tackled personal convictions, a "clear and present danger" to unity. In any local congregation, many convictions coexist; sometimes, they conflict. The Apostle cited two examples (NOTE: the weaker brother observes the more restrictive conviction).

"One person has faith that he may eat all things, but he who is weak eats vegetables only."

"One person regards one day above another, another regards every day alike."

(14:2, 5a)

A conviction, according to Paul, is an "opinion" (14:1, RSV, NASB, ESV), a passionate belief about proper behavior. Convictions are not scriptural commands. Even so, they represent our sincere attempts to apply biblical principles to daily living.

When personal convictions become a public conflict, Romans 14 specifies how to resolve the matter. The Apostle appealed to both quarrelers.


"Why do you pass judgment on your brother? Or you, why do you despise your brother?

For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God." "Let us pursue the things which make for peace and the building up of one another."

"The faith which you have, have as your own conviction before God."

(14:10, 19, 22a)

The Latin saying "In necessaris unitas; in dubiis libertas; in omnibus caritas" appears in the writings of Philipp Melanchthon (1497-1560), Rupertus Meldenius (1582-1651), and Richard Baxter (1615-1691). Translated into English, it reads, "In essential (things), unity; in uncertain (things), liberty; in all (things), charity." Paraphrased, it urges us to keep the main thing the main thing.
